

TRAVEL RESTRICTION WORLDWIDE

Issued: 05 February 2020

Republic of Mauritius

Any foreign national having resided in China or with a history of travel to and from China within the last 14 days will not be allowed entry or transit in the Republic of Mauritius.

Mauritian national residents, their spouse and children coming from China or having travelled through China within the last 14 days will be allowed entry in the Republic of Mauritius and will be placed in quarantine.

Angola

In response to the ongoing outbreak of Novel Coronavirus in Wuhan Hubei Province – The Peoples Republic of China.

Public health authorities require that all travellers complete a health declaration form before arrival. Your information will be used in accordance with local privacy laws to help fight the spread of the disease. Every traveller must complete a form. A parent or guardian may complete the form for a child.

Australia

Australian Government require that all arriving passengers complete an incoming passenger card.

If traveller advise they have travelled or transited through mainland China on or since 01.02.2020 and are not Australian citizens or permanent resident (or their immediate family, legal guardian or spouse) the airline is required to contact Border Operations Centre at +61 1300 368 126.

In most circumstances, if traveller does not meet the above travel conditions, they will be denied uplift (the mechanism of which will be VISA cancellation).

Arrangements will be made to re-instate visas as appropriate following the lifting of these measures.

In addition: If you arrive in Australia and it is determined that you have travelled to or transited through mainland China on or since 01.02.2020, your VISA will be cancelled and you will either be returned to your home country when flights are available or placed in an alternative place of detention for a quarantine period.

Please do not travel to Australia unless you are an Australian citizen or permanent resident (or their immediate family, legal guardian or spouse).

United States of America

The United States of America issued a directive, which restricts passengers who originated, transited or transferred from or through the Peoples Republic of China (excluding Hong Kong and Macau) entering the USA, effective as from 22:00GMT last night, 02 February 2020.

No passengers who visited, originated, transited or transferred through the Peoples Republic of China (**excluding Hong Kong and Macau**) within 14x days prior to departure to the USA, may be accepted for carriage to the United States. Airlines are required to question all passengers on their itineraries and/or verify travel documentation to verify any PRC routing.

Exemptions will only apply to the following:

- a) Air Crews
- b) USA Citizens
- c) Lawful permanent residents of the USA, holding a Permanent Resident Card, or Letter of Parole
- d) Any alien seeking entry into or transiting the United States pursuant to the specifications below. Any person not complying to the specifications must first be cleared by US Customs and Border Protection

Any of the above exempted categories who has been identified as originating, transited or transferred through The Peoples Republic of China, may continue to travel on SAA as both John F. Kennedy (New York) and Washington Dulles Airports are amongst eleven cleared airports to accept such passengers in the United States.

Alien seeking entry requirements:

- 1) Any alien who is the spouse of a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident. *Example of documentation: Passport or other information identifying individual as related to minor child with a US. passport; IR-visa package.*
- 2) Any alien who is the parent or legal guardian of a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident, provided that the U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident is unmarried and under the age of twenty-one. *Example of documentation: Passport or other information identifying individual as related to minor child with a US. passport; IR-visa package.*
- 3) Any alien who is the sibling of a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident, provided that both are unmarried and under the age of twenty-one. *Example of documentation: Passport or other information identifying individual as related to minor child with a US. passport; IR-visa package.*
- 4) Any alien who is the child, foster child, or ward of a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident, or who is a prospective adoptee who is seeking to enter the United States

pursuant to the IR-4 or IH-4 visa classifications. *Example of documentation: Passport or other information identifying individual as related to minor child with a US. passport; IR-visa package.*

- 5) Any alien traveling at the invitation of the United States Government for the purpose related to containment or mitigation of the virus. *Example of documentation: Letter of invitation on letterhead from the CDC.*
- 6) Any alien traveling as a non-immigrant under section 101(a)(15)(C) or (D) of the INA, 8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(15)(C) or (D), as a crewmember or any alien otherwise traveling to the United States as air or sea crew. *Example of documentation: Visa documentation contained in passport.*
- 7) Any alien seeking entry into or transiting the United States pursuant to an A-1, A-2, C-2, C-3 (as a foreign government official or immediate family member of an official), G-1, G-2, G3, G-4, NATO-I through NATO-4, or NATO-6 visa. *Example of documentation: Visa documentation contained in passport.*
- 8) Any alien whose entry would not pose a significant risk of introducing, transmitting, or spreading the virus, as documented by the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, or his designee. *Example of documentation: Written documentation from CDC.*
- 9) Any alien whose entry would further important United States law enforcement objectives, as determined by the Secretary of State, the Secretary of Homeland Security, or their respective designees based on a recommendation of the Attorney General or his designee. *Example of documentation: Designated point of contact to verify basis of travel.*
- 10) Any alien whose entry would be in the national interest, as determined by the Secretary of State, the Secretary of Homeland Security, or their designees. *Example of documentation: Standard process for verifying the admissibility of a passengers regarding status for entry into the United States.*

In addition, the United States of America implemented enhanced arrival protocols to ensure that all passengers from the Peoples Republic of China are provided public health services, which includes:

- Entry Screening
- Report of ill travelers by air carriers during travel
- Referral of ill travelers arriving at United States (US) port of entry by US custom and Border Protection.

Brazil

Brazil public health authorities a health declaration for all arriving passengers.

Hong Kong

Public health authorities require that all travellers complete a health declaration form before arrival. This information will be used in accordance with local privacy laws to help fight the spread of the disease. Every traveller must complete a form. A parent or guardian may complete the form for a child.

South Africa

The South African Department of Health has implemented measures to strengthen surveillance.

Port Health officials will be conducting further assessments using portable thermal scanners in the queuing maze. These none-contact tests take less than a minute as you approach immigration services.
